1 Now to old business. A, Elevator Safety
 2 Program Progress Report from Bob Capuani, the
 3 director.
 4 MR. CAPUANI: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
 5 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: You are welcome.
 6 MR. CAPUANI: Conveyances registered, we are up
 7 to 22,411; 93 contractors; 144 inspectors; 1,739
 8 mechanics, 710 apprentices; municipalities that have
 9 signed with the State, 137.
 10 MS. DELGRECO: Eight, as of this morning.
 11 MR. CAPUANI: 138. We had one more come in.
 12 Sorry.
 13 Inspection companies, and good news, we
 14 are putting the inspection companies in our database
 15 and you will be invoiced shortly. So there is 13
 16 inspection companies right now.
 17 Permits, so far this year we have issued
 18 423 permits, and so far right now we have sent out 280
 19 renewals for licenses, and the renewals are sent out
 20 120 days in advance.
 21 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: Is that it, Bob?
 22 MR. CAPUANI: That's it.
 23 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: Okay. Next, date for
 24 meeting with inspectors from Dick Gregory. Dick?

1 home until about 10:30 at night.
 2 MR. CAPUANI: Okay. We can pick a different
 3 date for you.
 4 MR. GREGORY: I'm kind of open. I mean, where
 5 do you -- you know, where do you want to do it,
 6 Chicago or Springfield first? I don't --
 7 MR. FENNELL: Doesn't matter.
 8 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: You just need to get the
 9 dates for us, correct?
 10 MR. CAPUANI: Yeah. I need to get the dates
 11 and see if I can get a room.
 12 MR. FENNELL: You can e-mail him some dates.
 13 MR. CAPUANI: Yeah. We need two dates.
 14 MR. HERTSBERG: You have the room for two days?
 15 MR. CAPUANI: One day. Just the 4th.
 16 Can you move it to the 5th?
 17 MR. GREGORY: But I won't get home -- is this
 18 in Springfield?
 19 MR. CAPUANI: Yeah.
 20 MR. GREGORY: I won't get home until after
 21 10:00 o'clock at night.
 22 MR. FENNELL: Which means he won't get down
 23 there on the 5th.
 24 MR. HERTSBERG: Unless he flew to Springfield.

1 MR. GREGORY: Well, when do you want to do it?
 2 MR. CAPUANI: Funny you ask that, because I
 3 have a room set up --
 4 MR. GREGORY: Good.
 5 MR. CAPUANI: -- for December 4th tentatively
 6 at the Northfield Inn in Springfield.
 7 MR. GREGORY: December 4th?
 8 MR. CAPUANI: Correct. I believe it is a
 9 Thursday.
 10 MS. DELGRECO: It is a Thursday.
 11 MR. GREGORY: On December 4th I am in Boston.
 12 MR. CAPUANI: Well, there will be an
 13 inspection. I have to have this meeting.
 14 MR. GREGORY: Okay.
 15 MR. CAPUANI: There is some confusion in the
 16 state and there is a common question asked from
 17 inspectors in the state of what constitutes a
 18 violation. So I think we need to have a little class
 19 so everyone is on the same page in the state.
 20 MR. GREGORY: Oh, I don't disagree that you
 21 need to do that. I mean, I think that's a very
 22 admirable thing to do, but the task group that I'm on
 23 for the use of elevators by firefighters during fires
 24 is all day Thursday, the 4th, in Boston. I won't get

1 MR. FENNELL: Well, no. I don't think so.
 2 MR. GREGORY: I don't think that works.
 3 MR. FENNELL: I think you need to get some
 4 dates that you are available so he can look for some
 5 facility to hold the class and then get back to you
 6 and set up the date and then do it.
 7 MR. GREGORY: Where do you want, Springfield or
 8 Chicago?
 9 MR. CAPUANI: I personally would like to have
 10 two of them.
 11 MR. FENNELL: Well, one of each.
 12 MR. GREGORY: Well, I know. One of each.
 13 Yeah, one of each. Where do you want to do it?
 14 MR. CAPUANI: I have to find us a place.
 15 MR. FENNELL: Maybe if you are not going to use
 16 the room, maybe schedule the room for another date.
 17 MR. GREGORY: 8, 11 and 12 of December.
 18 MR. CAPUANI: E-mail me the dates. How's that?
 19 E-mail me the dates.
 20 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: Are you done?
 21 MR. FENNELL: The 4th is the class?
 22 MR. CAPUANI: There is still going to be a
 23 class on the 4th, yes.
 24 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: K-1 key issues as it

1 pertains to new and existing elevators. Do you got an
 2 answer on that one?
 3 MR. CAPUANI: To update you, Mr. Gregory, John
 4 Thompson brought up an issue about the key -- K-1 key
 5 switch that if -- I know John is in the audience. If
 6 I'm right John, it stated in an existing building with
 7 four elevators and if you put in two new elevators, do
 8 we change all the key switches to K-1 even though they
 9 rae different banks, or do you leave the two different
 10 set of key switches? That was his question.
 11 MR. GREGORY: If it's different banks, they
 12 probably went out of business and went broke, but
 13 other than that -- (Laughter.) You are slow today.
 14 MR. FENNEL: Okay.
 15 MR. GREGORY: I would have to look in the
 16 A17.1.
 17 MR. CAPUANI: Here it is.
 18 MR. GREGORY: In Chicago I guaranty you you
 19 will have them all the same. You do have some time.
 20 That's a question that Joe Donnelly brought up years
 21 ago, maybe, 8 or 10 years ago at the City of Chicago's
 22 code meeting.
 23 Okay. It says in the code, "All
 24 elevators in the building shall be operable by the

1 same key." That's exactly what the code says. So if
 2 you are going to put in -- let's say you have a
 3 building I was at yesterday in Bloomington. They
 4 built this building. They didn't put enough elevators
 5 in. So they added two elevators to the building. If
 6 they got fire service, they would have to -- all the
 7 elevators in the building would have the same key.
 8 Now, seeing that it is a jail, they
 9 probably don't care if it burns, but that's what the
 10 code says. They will all be the same.
 11 MR. FENNEL: That includes, they all have
 12 to -- all existing elevators have to be changed to the
 13 same key? If you put in one elevator, you have to
 14 change 15 other elevators to the same key? That's
 15 what it says?
 16 MR. GREGORY: That's what it says. That's
 17 exactly what it says.
 18 MR. FENNEL: Okay.
 19 MR. CAPUANI: But if you don't do any upgrades
 20 to the building, it can stay the same.
 21 MR. GREGORY: If you do nothing, you don't have
 22 to change anything. If you do nothing, you don't have
 23 to change anything. Where it gets -- In Joe's case it
 24 was the Conrad Hilton, or I mean Steven's Hotel where

1 they were modernizing bank by bank, and as they were
 2 doing the modernization bank by bank they would change
 3 to whatever the new key switch was, but they were --
 4 they didn't have to change all of them in one lump.
 5 They just kept going on and on. Is that correct, Joe?
 6 MR. DONNELLY: Yeah. The issue is in the past
 7 like in Chicago you could reuse the key switch on the
 8 service car if you were just modernizing the service
 9 car, but the code now states you have to provide the
 10 K-1 on the new elevator, which then leads you to do
 11 the K-1 on the other elevators.
 12 MR. GREGORY: But when you asked that
 13 question --
 14 MR. FENNEL: Okay. Just so --
 15 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: Yeah. We can't be doing
 16 this across, okay? But that was Joe Donnelly.
 17 MR. GREGORY: That was under the '96 code, and
 18 it had similar words. So all the keys in the same
 19 building -- the firemen are going to come in and you
 20 are the fireman here. So you are going to come in
 21 wherever the address is, and you are going to get your
 22 keys either from -- Oh, correction to the minutes.
 23 K-N-O-X, Knox box.
 24 MS. DELGRECO: Thank you.

1 MR. GREGORY: It's a name of a manufacturer.
 2 They are going to go to wherever the keys are kept if
 3 they don't already have the keys like the K-N-O-X,
 4 Knox box. In there is going to be the key and it is
 5 supposed to work all the elevators.
 6 And in some suburbs and some in the City
 7 of Chicago, they have a different, you know, different
 8 people's key boxes. The question has come up
 9 nationally, if you had a "campus," and their
 10 interpretation is, as I recall nationally, if the
 11 buildings are built, and you got the Life Sciences
 12 building here and you got the dorm here, those are two
 13 different buildings. They don't have to be alike, but
 14 if they're the same building, they have to be alike.
 15 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: Okay.
 16 MR. CAPUANI: Okay.
 17 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: All right. Moving on,
 18 new business, is there any new business?
 19 MR. GILLES: I got something, Frank.
 20 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: Go ahead.
 21 MR. GREGORY: You are first.
 22 MR. GILLES: I'm looking for a little bit of a
 23 response from the Board. I came across an issue this
 24 month at a Monsanto facility in Farmer City. An

1 outfit by the name of Paul's Welding was installing an
 2 elevator, and I asked them if they were licensed
 3 mechanics. They told me no. I brought it to Chet's
 4 attention. Chet said there was some confusion as to
 5 whether this is supposedly a special purpose elevator,
 6 some confusion as to whether they were exempt from
 7 this law or not. I don't believe they are. I mean, I
 8 printed off the modified legislation, and they were
 9 exempt at one time, according to this, but then it was
 10 stricken. So my question is, are these things exempt
 11 and don't they have to be licensed contractors and
 12 licensed mechanics to be installing these?
 13 MR. SWIENTON: I would say yeah.
 14 MR. CAPUANI: What were they putting in? I'm
 15 sorry.
 16 MR. SWIENTON: What was the special purpose
 17 they were talking about?
 18 MR. CAPUANI: I was distracted, Rod.
 19 MR. GILLES: There's a picture of it. The guy
 20 from Paul's Welding told me he was subbed out there by
 21 Harris Industries, who Harris Industries is a licensed
 22 elevator contractor, but Paul's Welding is not.
 23 MR. CAPUANI: Special purpose personnel
 24 elevator.

1 MR. JIRIK: It is an elevator.
 2 MR. CAPUANI: Where was it at?
 3 MR. GILLES: It was being installed in a
 4 Monsanto facility.
 5 MR. CAPUANI: In a public right?
 6 MR. GILLES: Well, Chet, help me out here.
 7 It's -- Bob, all I can tell you it is in a
 8 factory-type environment. I'm not sure what they do
 9 in this building. It's a new building.
 10 MR. CAPUANI: My question usually then is,
 11 outside contractors come in and ride this elevator. A
 12 lot of them will say, well, it is for our personnel,
 13 but sometimes outside contractors come in. Well, you
 14 know what, then it needs to be registered and
 15 inspected.
 16 MR. GILLES: Sure. Chet, didn't you talk to
 17 Monsanto?
 18 MR. JANUS: Chet Janus for the Fire Marshal's
 19 Office, Inspector. I responded to the inquiry of Mr.
 20 Gilles, and when I presented my credentials to
 21 Monsanto and explained the situation, he was very
 22 receptive. He showed me the facility. When I arrived
 23 there there were no mechanics on site. I looked at
 24 the hoistway. It was explained to me that they have

1 35 to 40 employees who are trained in the use of the
 2 elevator, which to me is not one individual. That is
 3 30 or 40 personnel at this plant. Plus, I was also
 4 under the impression that during harvest season they
 5 have several non-employees that have access to this
 6 building that might be able to use this elevator also.
 7 It is not locked off for special purpose use.
 8 So when I left I wanted to get
 9 clarification through the Board. There was something
 10 mentioned like these wind devices where it is just a
 11 single unit, like a spider stage, where only one
 12 person uses it, they were exclusively on it. My
 13 interpretation, based on Harris Industries, who's a
 14 licensed contractor who bid this job was that it was
 15 going to be just for a specific use purpose, but it is
 16 not.
 17 (Mr. Mason enters)
 18 So going forward, I would like to make
 19 clarification that if these are in fact special
 20 purpose, special use elevators, it has to just be one
 21 person and no one else can use it, and I have not
 22 found in any of my investigations that fits that
 23 parameter.
 24 MR. CAPUANI: Is this unit running?

Page 16

1 MR. JANUS: Not yet. It's still under
 2 construction.
 3 MR. CAPUANI: So you are going to go back out
 4 there?
 5 MR. JANUS: Yes, I will.
 6 MR. GREGORY: Could we have the rule that --
 7 When the law was first passed, special purpose
 8 personnel elevators were excepted, and then the last
 9 amendment put them back in. Do we have -- do you have
 10 the wording of that law?
 11 MR. GILLES: Yeah. It's right there, Dick.
 12 All they did is simply mark it out under the
 13 exception.
 14 MR. GREGORY: That's what I -- that's what I
 15 recollected. Now, if it's marked out -- special
 16 purpose personnel elevators are defined in the A17
 17 code, and there is nothing that says, therefore, that
 18 it has to be a non-public or public. It has got
 19 nothing to do with it. It is a defined item in the
 20 code in A17.1. I tell you, I used to be chairman of
 21 the special purposes personnel --
 22 MR. CAPUANI: Yeah, but it does say in our act
 23 if it is used for maintenance purposes only. I will
 24 find that.

1 MR. GREGORY: Yeah. I would like to see that,
 2 because other than that, I think that all -- since it
 3 is now regulated, I think it's all special purpose
 4 personnel elevators as defined in ASME A17.1, 2007,
 5 are subject to our jurisdiction. Every one of them.
 6 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: You got your answer,
 7 Chet, right?
 8 MR. JANUS: Thank you very much. I appreciate
 9 that clarification.
 10 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: All right. I have
 11 something to bring up under new business. I have
 12 given Bob Capuani some. I get some calls on people
 13 that aren't licensed on elevators. Hawthorne
 14 Racetrack, supposedly their employees there have been
 15 working on the escalators, and then Evergreen Plaza,
 16 engineers took out a pump motor and they have not put
 17 it back in, and so I'm asking that -- and you have
 18 already given me the answer that you are going to send
 19 somebody out there to take a look at that.
 20 MR. CAPUANI: Correct. It will be handled this
 21 week.
 22 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: Dick, you had some new
 23 business for us?
 24 MR. GREGORY: I'm getting questions on

1 continuing education actually from many different
 2 sources, some Local 2 members and some NAESA members,
 3 and I would just like to be sure that we are clear on
 4 this, because I cannot speak for the Board, but we
 5 passed a motion, and I have not looked up in the
 6 minutes, but in essence we gave a blanket approval to
 7 a certain number of people's courses, like for
 8 example, NAESA, okay? So it seems --
 9 And the guy who called me about it, and
 10 this is yesterday while I was driving back from
 11 Bloomington, I said, we gave a blanket approval. He
 12 said, well, he had read the minutes. I said, then why
 13 are you calling me? I said, what Bob Capuani wants is
 14 a certificate that says they completed the eight hours
 15 of training, and he said, well, we -- and he's in a
 16 region of NAESA. He said, we are not going to issue
 17 this certificate. The certificate will be issued by
 18 the overall NAESA. I said, well, I mean, you are part
 19 of it. You are just part of it, and it is issued
 20 by -- It should not be an issue. Is that correct? I
 21 mean... Yeah.
 22 MR. FENNEL: It doesn't matter who issues the
 23 certificate.
 24 MR. CAPUANI: As long as it has the hours on

 2 MR. GREGORY: So that's what I told that
 3 gentleman.
 4 Now, elevator licensed mechanics, the
 5 question is, the National Elevator Industry
 6 Educational Program has on-line education. Now, I was
 7 at one time given the password and all that kind of
 8 stuff to sign on to look at it, but since I never did,
 9 I don't remember it, to be honest, and so I'm being
 10 asked if that is acceptable education. I mean,
 11 that's, let's say greater than half of the mechanics
 12 here in the State of Illinois, that's where they
 13 originally got their licenses. I mean, their
 14 mechanics card and all their training.
 15 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: Are you asking for a
 16 motion to approve?
 17 MR. GREGORY: I will move -- I mean, if we need
 18 to study it, if you want to tell me to go on-line and
 19 see what it says, but I mean, I move that we approve
 20 the National Elevator Industry Educational Program
 21 On-line Continuing Education for State of Illinois
 22 mechanics' continuing education requirements.
 23 MR. CAPUANI: Have you reviewed this at all?
 24 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: Hang on, Bob. That will

1 be under the question. There has been a motion made.
 2 Is there a second?
 3 MR. GILLES: Second.

 22 it's -- the people who have done -- the mechanics who
 23 have done that say they got on their computer and it
 24 is not like filling in a, you know, a form or

1 something. This is actually somebody giving them a
 2 lecture. I mean, I haven't done it personally, so...
 3 And you have. So you know more than I do on it.
 4 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: Is that actually --

 6 it is. It's an instructor. It is a video and you --
 7 Yeah. He's lecturing to you. It is not just reading.

 17 Illinois Fire Inspectors, for Westinghouse. I have
 18 been doing a lot of training over my career. I enjoy
 19 training. I think it is something that is needed.
 20 I have handouts showing the guides that
 21 have been used up in Wisconsin courses that I'm
 22 teaching up there, the power point presentations. I
 23 would just like to know what I need to do to allow
 24 myself to teach these courses to mechanics.

 2 I would like to see the paperwork on it.
 3 (Documents tendered)
 4 MR. DONNELLY: This was code overview that was
 5 by NAESA. There is three of them. This is the
 6 electrical one, one at the top is what I'm doing three
 7 weeks from now, training for them. That's my power
 8 point presentation. Here's another one. That being
 9 code.

 5 you can e-mail it to Elaine and she could e-mail it to
 6 all the Board members. I mean, if you are just trying
 7 to circulate this more quickly.
 8 MR. DONNELLY: Uh-hum. I didn't know, given
 9 the fact that I'm actually redoing a training program
 10 that I'm doing, it is already NAESA-approved, up in
 11 Wisconsin, part of this program is just redoing the
 12 training I'm doing up there for continuing education.
 13 It is already approved by NAESA.
 14 MR. GREGORY: So the question -- so the
 15 question is, that is this program that you are
 16 presenting a NAESA-approved program?
 17 MR. DONNELLY: Here's the brochure from the
 18 State of Wisconsin.
 19 MR. GREGORY: No. But that's --
 20 MR. DONNELLY: It's NAESA-approved. Here's a
 21 brochure that says NAESA-approved.
 22 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: If it is approved by
 23 NAESA, we don't have to give an okay on it.
 24 MR. GREGORY: If you can get a letter to us, I

1 don't know what month the minutes this is in, you
 2 know, don't stretch my memory that good. You know,
 3 the fact that I can remember back -- other things, if
 4 you can get a letter from Dottie that says this class
 5 is NAESA-approved --
 6 MR. DONNELLY: Okay.
 7 MR. GREGORY: -- and that it is eight hours,
 8 okay? If you would go look back at some old minutes
 9 of this, we approved NAESA-approved courses. Okay?
 10 MR. DONNELLY: But I'm not listed. When I look
 11 at the website NAESA is approved, but Donnelly is not.
 12 So I didn't know how that -- I mean, if I teach a
 13 NAESA course, I mean, does that qualify? Does that
 14 qualify as being acceptable?
 15 MR. GREGORY: NAESA gives credit for this if
 16 there is some inspectors in there. That's the --
 17 MR. DONNELLY: I'm not doing it for inspectors.
 18 I'm doing it for mechanics.
 19 MR. GREGORY: I understand. If an inspector
 20 was in this course, so of all these -- and we have a
 21 lot of mechanics that are also inspectors.
 22 MR. DONNELLY: Okay.
 23 MR. GREGORY: And a mechanic is in this course,
 24 it's also an inspector, will NAESA approve this for

1 MR. DONNELLY: Okay.
 2 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: Okay, Joe?
 3 MR. GREGORY: But that will speed it up. So
 4 there are two schemes here for you.
 5 MR. DONNELLY: Now, if I wanted to do a course
 6 on drive theory, let's say, which is not going to be a
 7 NAESA-approved course because NAESA doesn't care about
 8 drive theory, it would be more --
 9 MR. GREGORY: Now you got to come up with a
 10 whole outline and everything.
 11 MR. DONNELLY: Okay.
 12 MR. GREGORY: Yeah. If it's Donnelly and
 13 Associates Educational Arm, Division or whatever you
 14 are going to call it, then you come up with your own
 15 program and ask for that to be approved by the Board.
 16 MR. DONNELLY: Got it.
 17 MR. GREGORY: But again, give us the whole
 18 package of information ahead of time so we aren't
 19 here -- I mean, somebody from Otis was here, and we,
 20 you know, he was the first one to get your approval so
 21 he got the third degree from us. Then the next guy
 22 only got the second degree, okay, once we get into it.
 23 So get us the information ahead of time so we can make
 24 a rational decision.

1 the NAESA requirements? That makes it NAESA-approved.
 2 MR. DONNELLY: Okay. But again, if it is
 3 NAESA -approved, do I have to then ask to have
 4 Donnelly and Associates approved as well?
 5 MR. GREGORY: No.
 6 MR. DONNELLY: Then I understand Thyssen is
 7 approved and Otis is approved.
 8 MR. GREGORY: In my opinion, we could ask our
 9 general counsel or we could ask the Board, but in my
 10 opinion, it is my opinion, if it is NAESA-approved, if
 11 you get a letter, e-mail or whatever from the
 12 executive that says NAESA has approved this course for
 13 "x" number of hours, then it is NAESA approved.
 14 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: Joe, so you know, if
 15 NAESA doesn't approve it, come to the Board for the
 16 next meeting with all booklets for all Board members.
 17 MR. DONNELLY: Okay.
 18 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: And then come in front
 19 of us. We will decide to approve it or not.
 20 MR. GREGORY: Right. But you can speed up the
 21 process by the next meeting by e-mailing this stuff to
 22 us so she can e-mail it to everybody. Now, do I
 23 guaranty everybody is going to look at it? I'm not
 24 totally stupid.

1 MR. DONNELLY: So what you are saying, if it is
 2 a NAESA-approved course -- like let's say NAESA says I
 3 could do the code upgrade course in Chicago through
 4 NAESA.
 5 MR. GREGORY: Yes.
 6 MR. DONNELLY: Then I'm okay for that?
 7 MR. GREGORY: Yes.
 8 MR. DONNELLY: But if Donnelly and Associates
 9 were to do their own course, I would have to get it
 10 approved from NAESA or some other --
 11 MR. GREGORY: Or us. Or us.
 12 MR. DONNELLY: Okay. Very good.
 13 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: Thank you.
 14 MR. DONNELLY: Okay. I will need most of that
 15 back.
 16 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: Okay. The next one,
 17 Michael Gibbs.
 18 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Excuse me. Can I ask
 19 just one question?
 20 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: No. Unless you put a
 21 request in, you can.
 22 Michael Gibbs.
 23 MR. GIBBS: Good morning, everybody. I
 24 represent Anderson Elevator. I have submitted a

1 request for acceptance of our continuing education
2 program. Anderson Elevator has chosen to have Dick
3 Gregory teach our mechanics the class that he is
4 planing on teaching the inspectors throughout the
5 state. There will be no compensation involved for
6 Dick.

7 And the second request is that your group
8 accept a continuing education program that has already
9 been concluded that was presented by Zach McCain to
10 our mechanics that currently service the Chicago
11 Transit Authority. As far as a syllabus, I would have
12 to throw that to --

13 MR. CAPUANI: Yeah. Let me clarify this a
14 little bit. If the Board accepts the Zach McCain,
15 there are CTA employees that work for CTA that CTA
16 has -- that would be a separate program done by
17 Anderson Elevator.

18 MR. GIBBS: Yes.

19 MR. CAPUANI: So those from CTA would not be
20 qualified.

21 MR. GIBBS: I was informed that the class that
22 our fellas sat in was only Anderson people.

23 MR. CAPUANI: You are only voting for Anderson.
24 The CTA would have to appear before the Board for

1 No second. No second on the motion.
2 Okay. So what we are saying is that, again, I guess,
3 Dick, they want to see the paperwork on it.

4 MR. GREGORY: Thank you. I gave you the
5 paperwork some months ago. The class is on A17.3.
6 It's a code class and it takes A17.3 -- and I don't
7 know how many months ago, but I can probably look it
8 up and see when it first was done.

9 It takes A17.3, lists the requirements in
10 small words, doesn't copy the code, and has comments
11 about why that requirement is in A17.3, and then some
12 estimates of mine based on how many elevators in the

15 MR. GIBBS: I believe that was distributed at
16 the last meeting in Springfield.

17 MR. GREGORY: Okay. Here.

18 MS. DELGRECO: It was the A17.3 discussion.

19 MR. CAPUANI: The purpose for this meeting was
20 supposed to be for you to be an inspector instructor.

21 MR. GREGORY: Well, it wasn't. The reason that
22 was brought up was -- but that is exactly what it is.

23 The reason I brought it up is that there has been this
24 huge confusion on A17.3 and what their requirements

1 their program.

2 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: Before we go any
3 further, is there a motion to accept Anderson's
4 continuing education? Dick, I don't think you can.

5 MR. GREGORY: I can't make that motion.

 23 MR. NEHR: Okay. Then I don't know the project
 24 myself specifically, but it would be the same

 4 appeared.
 5 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: Is there a motion to

 9 MR. JIRIK: Second.
 10 CHAIRMAN CHRISTENSEN: It has been seconded by
